#### **Did You Know That...**

**The Canadian stamp (Scott #1278)** issued June 29, 1990 was the first stamp sponsored by the Canadian Chamber of Commerce commemorating the 25th anniversary of the Canadian flag.

The very first USA semi-postal was released July 29, 1998. It

was considered the most important issue of 1998. 280 million stamps of US  $40\phi$  were printed. By August 1999 it had raised US\$7.8m for Breast Cancer research.

**The Netherlands** issued the first 5 stamps designed by computer on April 7, 1970,. They came out in five different colours. The black and white one is shown here.



**Auction News:** On September 28-29, 1993, during an auction at Christie's, a mixed franking cover to England with a horizontal strip of five US 1847 5¢ red brown (Scott #1 - B. Franklin) and a Canada 1851 3d "Beaver" sold for \$717,500. Please come to our auction on November 15, 2000.

So, if you can afford some time to help make these events work or, if you have your own ideas on making the club meetings more interesting, please make yourself known!

Having said that, I do believe stamp collecting is for pleasure and relaxation. **More exciting auction news:** On April 23, 1996, a Canada 12d black on laid paper<sup>1</sup> on an 1852 cover from Montréal to New York sold for U\$ 253,000 at Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries. Another good reason to attend our auction.

**1995 set the first record** for output of world wide issues of stamps and sheets. It reached over 12,000. Guyana led the race with 497 stamps. The USA ranked 9th with a total of 217 units.

**Tristan da Cunha**, with a population of about 300 is a group of islands in the mid South Atlantic and is a dependency of St. Helena. Since 1936 it has issued its own stamps. Scott Catalogue Vol.6 lists them all. For more information write to: Postmaster, Tistan da Cunha, South Atlantic. Info. on E-mail or Website not available. This may be a challenge for one of our members with computer(s).

<sup>1</sup> Laid paper is one of the two basic types of paper used in stamp printing. Laid paper is distinguished from wove paper by the presence of thin, parallel lines visible when the paper is held to the light. The lines are usually a few millimetres apart.

- After all lots have been sold, the recorder will give you a sheet showing the lots you have bought and how much you have spent. 10% will be added to the account as a "club commission" to help defray expenses (mainly publicity).
- Pay the cashier (cash much preferred) who will hand over your purchases.

In the (unlikely) event of any dispute or misunderstanding, the auctioneers' decision is final.


