July 1st (Sunday), is the date the "Portrait of a Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau" will be released. A Souvenir sheet in a special designed folder containing 4 stamps @ 47¢ ea. will be available. There will also be special Commemorative Tribute.

During the summer, the stamp issues are few and far between. On July 30^{th} , there will be a release of four 47ϕ stamps depicting "ROSES".

August will see another three new commemoratives, including the annual "Art" one – this time a reproduction of a painting by Jack Shadbolt.

The stamp issue of the 35¢ Dennis Chavez and the 29¢ Earl Warren (Scott #2186–2184) were printed in quantities of 480 and 250 million respectively. They were absolutely fine, they had beautiful perforations, were not invert, they were printed for a competitive price, but they had one thing our neighbours to the south did not like and that was:

they were printed in Ottawa.

That's why there was an uproar int he US Congress. Isn't it sad to learn that 40 highly qualified people in Mississauga are going to lose their jobs because Ashton Potter's parent company, MDC, is transferring Canadian Stamp production to Buffalo NY. This is a great loss not only for these people in Mssissauga, but for all Canadians. I suggest we all write to our Federal MP and let him/her know what we think about this issue.

2. was about the entrance fee to the Post Museum in Monaco. When the Euro (ε) was introduced on January 1st, 1999, the value of ε I was set to be the equivalent of 6.55957 French Francs or, in reverse, 1Fr = ε 0.15245. If the original fee was 20Fr, this would be ε 3.05.
